Stage 1 cams are designed by RPW as a drop in cam. The idea behind strong springs is to insure that the valve closes when it is supposed to and not float between cam lobe cycles which can be detrimental to your engine. You can't go wrong with having stronger springs but it's unnecessary for stage 1 cams. We are still wondering what cams will do to a N/A 3G as well since most customers typically buy turbo or supercharger cams. Good luck with your setup and we are eagerly awaiting to hear your results :)

- Race prep block (Magnafluxed, Cleaned, Decked and Equalized,
- Align-bored mains, New Freeze Plugs and Oil Galley Plugs)

ARP Rod bolts

Add \$350 for shipping

Options:

\$700 for Crower Rods

So, it's like your basically getting free shipping on the block.

We've found in the past that the stock Eclipse ECU attempts to compensate for small modifications added to the 6G72 which means that what you would normally get as a HP increase in most cars is not realized near as much in the V6 Eclipse. This is why many Eclipse owners have chosen to go Turbo. Once it's all said and done, spending equal amounts of money to stay NA vs FI, the forced induction motor will produce MUCH more HP to the wheels. As far as the SAFC goes, it does seem to help lean out a very rich air to fuel ratio in this motor. This mod is definitely worth the money and useful in either the NA or FI application.

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
